Shredding and E-Recycling Event Planned

The City of Pelham has once again partnered with Protec Recycling to provide free document shredding and electronic recycling services for residents on Saturday, October 1, 2022, from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm. Participants should note the new location for the event. Protec trucks will be at the Depot at Pelham City Park, located at 300 Ball Park Road, across from Pelham Park Middle School.


There is a six-box limit for free document shredding. Residents should not bring the paper in three-ring binders, and Protec will not accept any wet paper. Manila folders, envelopes, office paper, etc. are fine. Staples and paper clips are fine, but please, no binder clips. Residents may bring the paper in any sort of receptacle, and they will get their boxes, bags, etc. back after their documents are securely placed in the shredder.

Those looking to discard CRT monitors will be charged \$10.00 each. Flat-panel monitors are free. Protec will also provide secure hard drive destruction for \$10.00 per drive. Television sets are NOT accepted.

City of Pelham Job Fair

The City of Pelham will hold a Job Fair on Tuesday, September 27, 2022, from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm at the Pelham Recreation Center Gym, located at 2020 Pelham Park Boulevard. Job opportunities are available in several City departments, including Police, Fire, Ballantrae Golf Club, Pelham Racquet Club, Parks and Recreation, Development Services and Public Works, and the Pelham Civic Complex and Ice Arena.

Like many employers, the City of Pelham currently has a variety of open positions available. According to Tracy Hill, Director of Human Resources, the City is recruiting for both full-time and part-time positions. "We need qualified individuals to fill these openings," said Hill. "Not everyone has a clear idea in mind for their career path. This gives job-seekers the chance to learn more about the services and opportunities offered by the City. Attendees can talk with department heads and learn about the types of positions available and the work performed by city employees."

Openings include positions for police officers, firefighters, firefighter-medics, dispatchers, street technicians, and municipal associates.

Paint it Pink

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and the Pelham Fire Department is once again raising funds for research to benefit patients right here in Alabama. The fundraiser has two aspects, which makes it easy to participate. The department is selling special t-shirts for breast cancer awareness, and will also paint city fire hydrants pink to honor or memorialize someone who has been affected by the disease. All money raised is donated directly to the Breast Cancer Research Foundation of Alabama (BCRA), which funds local, lifesaving breast cancer research at institutes across the state.

Robin Wilkinson, Administrative Assistant of the Pelham Fire Department, and Firemedic Buddy Ingleright came up with the fundraising idea in 2011 after BCRA

representatives approached the Pelham Fire Department looking for ways to raise additional funds. "The cause resonated with Fire Medic Ingleright because his mother is a breast cancer survivor. It all hit home with me in 2018 when I was diagnosed with stage 1 breast cancer. Now, I'm a four-year survivor," said Wilkinson.

Members of the community can purchase a t-shirt for \$15 from Pelham Fire Station Number One Monday - Friday from 7:00 am to 4:00 pm This year's shirt will be navy blue with a light pink design. Sizes range from small to 2XL.

Pink fire hydrants are \$100, and forms are available at Fire Station One. Wilkinson explained, "When someone makes a \$100 donation, we paint the hydrant pink and we also place a sign in honor of, or in memory of a person the donor designates. The hydrants remain pink until January when the Pelham Fire Department conducts annual maintenance, and then it is painted back to its original color."

Wilkinson estimated the Pelham Fire Department has raised almost \$28,000 for BCRA over the years. Last year's campaign raised almost \$3,000 alone. The goal for this year's fundraiser is \$3,500. "Because of the research that's been made possible through organizations like BCRA, so many more women are surviving breast cancer now than they did years ago. I'm a firm believer that I'm standing here today because of the research that's been done," said Wilkinson.
