



Pelham's Gateway: Improved Curb Appeal for the City

The City of Pelham is set to enhance its northern gateway on Highway 31, creating a more inviting and visually appealing entrance. The Commercial Development Authority (CDA) has acquired the land where a vacant Metro by T-Mobile building stands. An abandoned snow cone hut was recently removed from the site.

"Improvements will be made to the entire property, including removing asphalt and landscaping the entire area. This will include installing site lighting, planting trees, and incorporating other beautification elements," said Michael Simon,

Economic Development Director for the City of Pelham. "The entrance to your town is like the front yard of your home. You want that curb appeal to be pleasing. Likewise, when you welcome visitors to your city, you want to put your best foot forward."

Simon said the property acquisition has been in the works for three years. "In the development world, this is typical because you're trying to purchase land from private property owners. We're happy the project can move forward."
